# **January Professional Development Meeting**



**Speaker: Tom Valentine Target Logistics Services** 

**Topic: Incoterms**

Do you know the difference between a term of sale and a term of payment? You should, your international customer does. How can you use incoterms to your advantage? Do you know the difference between ex-works and deliver duty paid in terms of documents, risk transfer, insurance and cost of goods? Did you know the difference of one letter in an incoterm could save your company thousands?

How can you use incoterms to minimize your company's exposure, reduce risk, save money and even increase sales? Learn how to determine responsibilities between buyer and seller, through transfer of risk, insurance, documentary requirements and cost of freight through proper use of incoterms.

Thomas Valentine has owned his own freight forwarding and logistics company for more than 19 years. In October of 2006, he sold his company to the Target Logistic Services group (Amex: TLG). Tom is recognized as an industry leader in international logistics education and compliance training. He has extensive import and export experience and has been recognized be the state and federal government for his assistance to global companies. Target Logistic Services is a publicly traded company that provides global distribution and logistics services for businesses.

Tom Valentine began in the transportation industry straight out of SUNY/Potsdam. He began as a sales representative for Air Logic, developing Fairfield County, CT. Soon after his first year, he was sought out by a bigger operation and made the move to WTC Airfreight. Working out of the JFK office Tom continued to build his knowledge in the forwarding industry in Westchester and Bronx counties. Because of his performance and his potential, WTC selected Tom to work out of their London office. This was the first time ever that WTC selected a representative from the U.S. to work in an overseas operation. There he obtained knowledge relating to global logistics with an emphasis on Far East & Middle East cargo movement. In 1988, Valentine went from working for large international freight forwarders to forming his own freight forwarding company in Latham, NY. With his previous experience, and years spent learning abroad, he was able to start his one man, local operation. Territory rights soon began to expand from just coverage in the Capital Region to as far west as Syracuse and Rochester, north to Burlington, VT, east into Bennington County, VT and Berkshire County, Massachusetts as well as reaching to Binghamton, NY and Newburgh, NY. His office employees over 15 people and sales reach well in excess of \$12,000,000.00 per year. Valentine is active in many business community growth projects and development organizations. He has been appointed to the NY State District Export Council, he is on the board of directors for the Center for Economic Growth and the Global Business Network. He is an active member or many other trade development organizations, including the Capital District Transportation Committee, Chief Executives Network, Albany, Latham and Syracuse Chambers of Commerce. Valentine is in demand as a lecturer on international logistics. He has recently spoken in front of the following corporate groups: National Association of Purchasing Managers, (the Albany and Glens Falls Chapters), Karl Suss of America; Albany International Corp, Export NY - International Logistics (for the Center for Economic Growth) and at the College of St. Rose: Service Marketing; the MBA program at SUNY/Albany as well as Skidmore College.

Tom has received *numerous* awards, from the New York State Governor's Award for Achievement in Export and The Capital Regions Top 40 under 40.

- A professional who is consulting or teaching supply chain functions
- Employed in the field of supply chain management
- Working with enterprise resource planning (ERP) systems
- An employer wanting to create a common standard of understanding, vocabulary, resources, and frameworks within your company to address your supply chain challenges and opportunities.
- An employer or manager wanting to create a common standard of competency across your organization
- A CPIM needing certification maintenance points. Earn 50+ professional development points toward CPIM certification maintenance through the Learning System and APICS CSCP certification exam.
